Miami County Speedway kicked off the racing season 4/23/2011 with racing in six classes. The non-points racing may be a tune-up for 2011.

In the junior class, Jered VanNess took the feature win in his new ride over Kameron Butcher, Kayleb Bolton, Seth Ireland and Noah Brooks.

Senior action had Bob Bourff in the red number 97 machine picking up where he finished last year, in Victory Lane. Jeff Weideman, Bob Harrington, Russ Gamester and Wesley Bigger rounded out the top five. Bob Harrington is dialing in his new GRP car and Russ Gamester was piloting one of the Todd Black GRP rides.

The restrictor class had Zane DeVault capture his first Miami County Speedway feature win. He had ran this Ray Racing machine only a few times late last season. Callie Wolsiffer, Spencer Bayston, Cole Angle, and Deaven Bolton chased Zane to the victory checkers.

In the non-wing class the action was hot and heavy with any one of five cars taking a shot at the lead for the win. But, when the dust settled Brandon Rose prevailed as the winner as he bested Laine Hite, Ryan Kline, Jacob Moore, and Russ Gamester. Combatant Tyler Gunn took a nasty spill on the back straight during the feature. He was able to walk away as his machine was trailered off the racing surface. Earlier in the night competitor in this class, Zeke Lewis flipped entering turn one. Zeke and his ride made the feature to finish in seventh position.

The drive of the night was in the wing feature. At the green, a miscue in turn one sent many cars to a halt requiring them to restart at the rear of the field. That set the stage for seasoned racer Sara Elrod to put on a racing clinic for a high side drive from the rear of the pack and she did not stop until Victory Lane. The young lady was hooked up and hauling. Austin, Mead, Ryan Leek, Ron Dennis, and Zeke Lewis filled out the top five.
